

ORDINANCE NO. 2017-40

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 2016-28, ADOPTED DECEMBER 13, 2016, RELATIVE TO PROPERTY OWNER ASSESSMENTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE OKLAHOMA WATER LINE REPLACEMENT AND RESURFACING PROJECT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, on December 13, 2016 the Huron City Council authorized Ordinance 2016-28, an ordinance determining to proceed with the planned improvement for paving and waterlines within the Oklahoma Subdivision; and, to assess the affected property owners with the expense associated with the waterline replacement in the form of an annual special assessment for a period of twenty years; and,

WHEREAS, upon examination of the budget and identification of available reserve funds, the Huron Finance Committee has recommended that the Huron City Council consider the offset of the special assessment upon the property owners; and,


WHEREAS, the Huron City Council through discussion with and recommendation from the Huron Finance Committee has expressed a desire to offset the portion of the project which was previously directed to be collected in the form of a special assessment upon the property owners,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HURON, OHIO:


SECTION 1. Upon accepting the recommendation of the Huron Finance Committee, the Huron City Council hereby desires to terminate the legislative assessment process related to the Oklahoma Water Line Replacement and Resurfacing Project as expressed in Ordinance Number 2016-28 adopted December 13, 2016, and hereby seeks to repeal the same as it relates to the individual property owner assessment process. By repealing Ordinance Number 2016-28, the Huron City Council expresses its intent to not pursue the special assessment collection process on the property owners affected by the Oklahoma Water Line Replacement Resurfacing Project.

SECTION 2. That this Council hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the adoption of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of its Committees, if any, which resulted in formal action, were taken in meetings open to the public in full compliance with applicable legal requirements, including O.R.C. §121.22.

SECTION 3. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, necessary for the public health, safety and welfare and for the further reason of expedience in the termination of the assessment process and notification to the County Auditor, wherefore, in accordance with 3.07 of the Charter of the City of Huron, Ohio, the ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately following its adoption.
